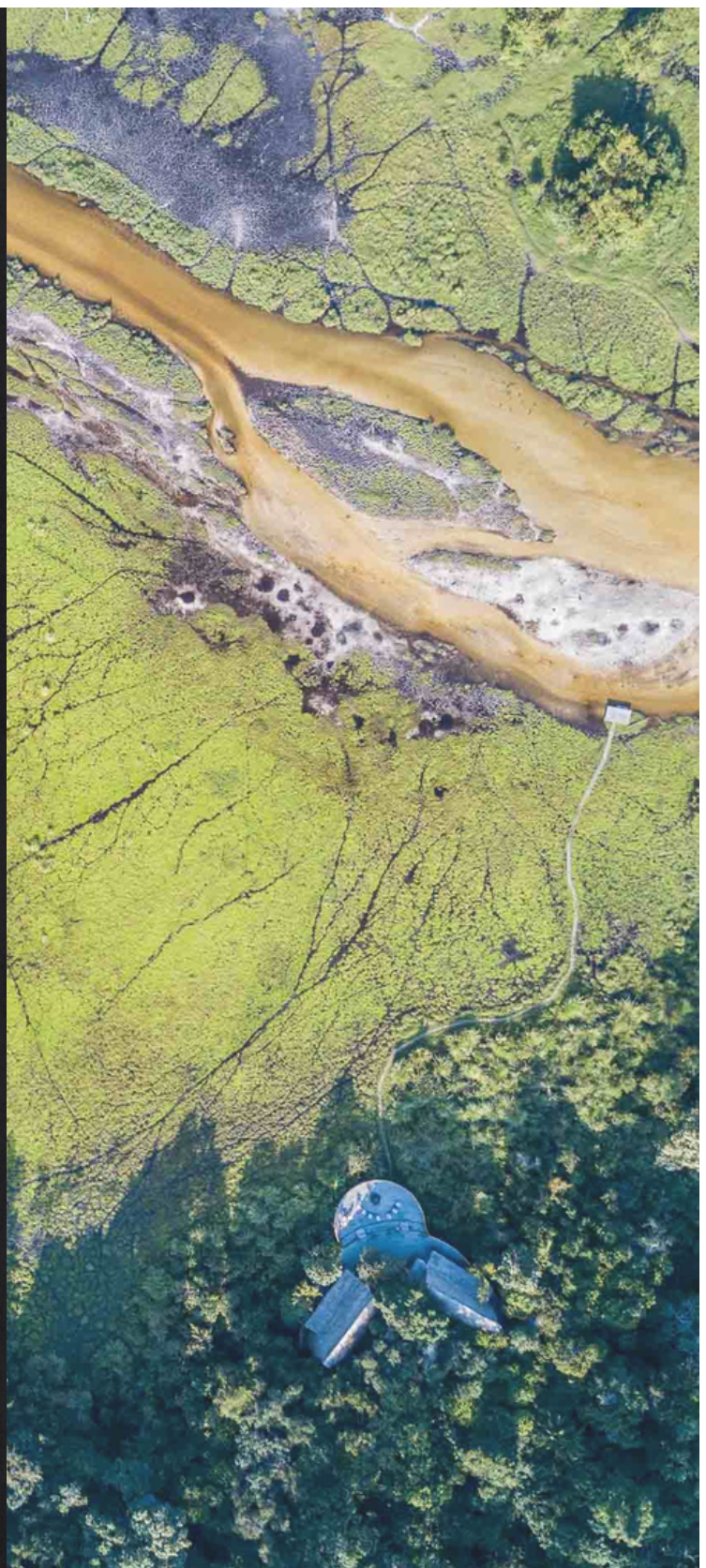

DID YOU KNOW?



The Odzala-Kokoua Forest Massif was officially designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2023.



The Congo Basin rainforest is second in size only to the Amazon.



As a vital carbon-sink storing 70-80 billion metric tons of carbon; this is the ultimate carbon-negative destination.



Unparalleled biodiversity with over 10,000 plant species, 1,000 bird species, more than 400 mammal species, and new species unknown to scientists being discovered to this day.



Home to globally significant populations of critically endangered western lowland gorillas (estimates range from 100,000 - 200,000 individual gorillas in the ROC), forest elephants, chimpanzees, bongo, and other primate species, offering unique opportunities for wildlife observation and research.



Relatively unknown to the outside world, the Congo Basin is one of the most remote and exclusive wildlife experiences offered in Africa. Odzala is an untouched wilderness where mass tourism does not exist; with fewer than 350 visitors per year it is the ideal destination for anyone truly looking for 'off the beaten path'.
